Elsie was born in 1898 at Newnham and in 1901 they were living at Doddington. In 1911 William and Eliza had four children: Twins - Frank & Elsie aged 13, Daisy aged 11 and Lilian aged 9.

During Service:

Elsie contracted Spanish Flu whilst still in service and sadly died.

Family Story:

In 1911 her parents were shown as living at 110, Wincheap St. Canterbury, Kent. This is also confirmed in the Elham Cemetery Records.

Elsie's Next of Kin is recorded as being her sister Miss D. Carpenter, Shuttlesfield, Acrise, as shown in this document. Elsie Cullen is the daughter of Elise's brother Frank and still lives in Elham.
